
A ride on a canoe made of 100-year-old cedar & a wild game lunch /MARUGO

• Savor a meal of local ingredients including wild game amongst the great outdoors. Plates are made of local wood, offering participants the chance to enjoy the true bounty of local nature.

Iitaka is home to a lush forest and the clear Kushida River. In the past, the river carried lumber lashed into rafts all the way to the open plains. To share this history, the idea of the century-old cedar canoe was born. This canoe, hand carved from a 100-year old cedar tree, features beautiful wood grain patterns, and is a recipient of the Wood Design Award. This activity offers participants the chance to travel down the Kushida River and experience its historic logging days. A trip through the woods near the source of the river with the canoe is a great way to take in the sights of the forest of lidaka and experience its harmonious coexistence with man. After canoeing, participants will enjoy a lunch of wild game and other local ingredients. (There is only one 100-year old cedar canoe. Parties with two or more participants must take a regular canoe.)
